Dear Friends of The Merwin Conservancy,

We are happy to report that the Merwin Palm Forest is thriving and filled with new learning thanks to a series of student field trips taking place amongst the palms of Pe'ahi. Children and their teachers are learning first-hand lessons about deep ecology, land stewardship, soil restoration, gardening, and the power of planting trees.

Through these visits and the growing partnerships with their teachers and schools, we are giving these young students the opportunity to see themselves as integral parts of their natural world, and then to write about it. In the process, they are learning to express themselves and their feelings from their experiences amongst the palms through poetry and illustrations, inspired by the knowledge that they are walking in the footsteps of W.S. Merwin.

The poems and art these students have created during their time walking, observing and thinking within the garden are extraordinary. These creative responses to the Merwin Palm Forest embody a critical part of the mission of the Conservancy, namely to inspire a new generation to understand first hand the importance of the connections between language, art and place.

We have included a poem and a drawing created by two Maui 5th graders while sitting under a canopy of palm leaves on page three of this newsletter. We encourage you to visit our website, where more student poems and art are available.
